Welcome to the 2015 EU-U.S.: Bridging NanoEHS Research Efforts joint workshop

Here is some practical information to help make your stay in Venice as pleasant as possible.

Arriving in Venice by airplane

- Venice airport "Marco Polo"
- Treviso airport "Canova" (about 25 Km from Venice)

Arriving in Venice by train

- Railway station "Venezia Santa Lucia"

How to reach Venice from the Marco Polo Airport

...By bus

- **LAND - BUS N° 5.** The buses leave from a stop conveniently located in front of the arrivals area. The ACTV buses are orange and the journey usually takes about 30 minutes. Ordinary tickets cost € 6,00 - ONE WAY and 11,00 € - from or to airport and return. Click on [ACTV website](#) for [timetables](#)
- **Shuttle ATVO** to Venezia, Piazzale Roma/ Bus Terminal. It's a direct connection from the airport to Venice that takes about 20 minutes; buses leave every half hour, from 8.50 (8.30 on Sundays and public holidays) to 23.40. Fares: one-way ticket is 10.00 €/ roundtrip ticket is 18.00 € (valid 7 days). The buses leave outside the arrivals area on the right. The ATVO buses are blue. Click on [ATVO website](#)

...By taxi/water taxi

Fare: about 30 € for land taxi (click on [RadioTaxiVenezia](#)) and 100 € for water taxi (Click on [WaterTaxiVenezia](#))

How to reach Venice from the Canova Airport

...By bus

Direct shuttle ATVO to Venezia, **Piazzale Roma**/Bus Terminal Departs from a stop located in front of the arrivals area of the airport. Fares: one-way ticket is 10.00 €/ roundtrip ticket is € 18.00. Click on [ATVO website](#).

....By taxi

Fare: about € 50. Click on [RadioTaxiTreviso](#) or [RadioTaxiVenezia](#)



How to reach Venice by train

Venice has rail connections with every major city in Italy and the rest of Europe. The main train station (Venezia Santa Lucia) is located next to the Grand Canal in the northwest corner of the city. Some trains stop at Venezia- Mestre on the mainland: to get from Venezia- Mestre to Santa Lucia, or vice versa (a 10-minute trip) you can take any train. However, please be aware that there is an extra charge for travelling on Intercity and Eurocity trains that should be paid prior to departure.

How to reach Venice by car

Follow the sign to Venice. Once you arrive in Mestre, drive to the Ponte della Libertà – a long straight road in the Lagoon, linking Venice to the mainland. In Venice you will arrive at **Piazzale Roma**. Here you have to leave your car and proceed by feet or by boat. There are three parking areas at Piazzale Roma: Autorimessa Comunale, Garage S. Marco and the open air car park S. Andrea. Other car parks are at **Tronchetto**, with fast connection to Piazzale Roma by [People Mover](#)

Transportation within Venice

The public transportation in Venice is served by “vaporetto” boats. The company providing the service is **ACTV**. In the [website](#) you can find information about vaporetto lines and timetables. Single fare: € 7,00/ ticket valid for 1 hour.
